- FEMA
 - The National Hurricane Center has issued its last advisory for Delta.
 - Delta has been downgraded to a tropical depression.
 - There are approximately 600,000 power outages in Louisiana.
- CISA Region VI
 - Focused on impacts to energy, communications, and water.
- Community Lifelines
 - FEMA, ESF #6
 - As people are reporting to congregate shelters, and as damage assessments are completed and if they can't return, they're being moved non-congregate shelters (hotels).
 - USDA, ESF #11
 - There are no significant issues. However, continuing to work with state counterparts.
 - Transportation
 - Clean-up is underway.
 - Energy
 - DOT
 - Stand ready to deploy SMEs to assist the states.
 - American Public Power Association
 - Mutual assistance compacts have been activated – resources are coming from 16 states. Over 12,000 resources have been mobilized.
 - It's too early to provide an estimated time of restoration (ETR).
 - Urged audience to check social media for their local utilities to get the latest on ETRs.
 - Communications, ESF #2
 - Wireline issues are minor, mostly power-related.
 - Cellular is similar, most outages follow the path of the hurricane.
 - 10 percent are out in Louisiana; 6 parishes are greater than 20 but less than 30, 7 parishes greater than 30, which is much better than Laura.
 - No PSAPs are out of service.
 - Supply Chain
 - Flooding has interrupted some demand nodes, but there are less disruptions at the distribution nodes.
 - Long-term disruptions of private sector supply chains are not anticipated.
 - Focus is on getting back to long-term recovery efforts that were already underway from Laura.
