

- Maximum sustained winds 25 mph




Hurricane Linda (CAT 2) (Advisory #29 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

Current Disturbances and Five-Day Cyclone Formation Chance: 🔀 < 40% 💥 40-60% 💥 > 60%

Tropical or Sub-Tropical Cyclone: O Depression Storm Hurricane

- 1,000 miles WSW of southern tip of Baja California
- Moving W at 10 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 90 mph
- Should remain a hurricane through Wednesday
- Hurricane force winds extend 30 miles
- Tropical storm force winds extend 100 miles

Atlantic



Tropical Depression Fred (Advisory #31 as of 5:00 a.m. ET) - FINAL

- 15 miles SSW of Columbus, GA
- Moving NNE at 14 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 35 mph
- Forecast to degenerate to a remnant low by tonight
- Fred is expected to move across western and northern GA today
- This is last Public Advisory

Tropical Storm Grace (Advisory #16 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)


- 165 miles E of Montego Bay, Jamaica
- Moving W at 16 mph
- Maximum sustained winds at 40 mph
- Could be near hurricane strength as it approaches the Yucatan Peninsula of Mexico late Wednesday and early Thursday

Tropical Storm Henri (Advisory #6 as of 5:00 a.m. ET)

- 135 miles SSE of Bermuda
- Moving WSW at 5 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 50 mph
- Should pass well to the south of Bermuda late today or tonight

Tropical Activity – Southeast US


Situation: The greatest potential for heavy rainfall and flooding impacts are along the Florida Panhandle into southeastern Alabama. Emergency Declaration FEMA-3562-EM-FL was approved August 16.

Impacts:

- AL: 2 shelters open with no occupants
- FL: 3 shelters open, multiple shelters on standby
- FL: Significant flooding along FL Panhandle;
- Many roadway closures due to flooding and debris have since been reopened
- FL: Gulf & Atlantic railroad suspended operations from Tallahassee to Pensacola
- FL & AL: Multiple counties with school and government facility closures

State/Local Response

- FL EOC at Partial Activation (TC Fred), Governor declared State of Emergency for 23 counties; FL National Guard Activated
- AL EOC at Normal Operations
- GA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- MS EOC at Partial Activation
- Seminole Tribe of Florida EOC at Partial Activation (TC Fred); Tribal Chairman signed a tribal state of emergency
- Miccosukee Tribe of Florida and Poarch Band of Creek Indians monitoring; no change in activation level
- State officials have been coordinating closely with electric power companies throughout the Panhandle to ensure they are prepared



FEMA Response

- Region IV RWC at Enhanced Watch (day shift only 7:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m.)
 - RRCC rostered, on alerted and placed on standby
 - IMAT-1/IMAT-2 are Available
- FEMA HQ
 - NWC coordinating with Regions, NHC, and National Water Center
 - NRCC at Level III (COVID-19)
 - National IMAT Blue to support Region IV if needed
 - DEC: MERS assets identified/deployable; Mobile IOF ready to support IMAT deployment
 - Logistics: Pre-positioned 1.4M meals and 1.1M water at Craig Field
 - US&R: IST rostered on 2hr PTDO
 - Operations: Vaccination/Ambulance contracts activated; 20 ambulances in MO, 50 ambulances/paramedics in LA
 - FOD: FCOs identified for each state in RIV
 - Emergency Declaration FEMA-3562-EM-FL approved





National Weather Forecast


Situation:

- The fire began on August 15 and is burning on state and private land in and around the communities of Ford, Springdale, Loon Lake, and Clayton (combined population of 2,500)
- Threatening 400 homes (all primary), state and private communications infrastructure on Scoop Mountain, numerous repeaters providing service for WA state Patrol and county EMS, fire, and law enforcement, and cell phone towers belonging to Verizon and AT&T
- 27 structures destroyed; at least 7 were primary residences
- All of Rail Canyon Road has been shut down
- 2 shelters open

Response:

- WA EOC at Partial Activation (COVID-19)
- FEMA Region X / Bothell MOC and NWC continue to monitor
- FMAG approved August 16


Situation:

- The fire began on July 30, and is burning on federal, state, and private land in and around Junction City, Weaverville, Hayfork, and Douglas City (combined population 5,524)
- Threatening 5,053 homes (85% are primary residences, 15% are secondary residences), 400 commercial structures, Trinity Water System, 40,000 acres of commercial timber land, the Trinity River Lumber Company, County Fire, Sheriff's Office, Cal Hwy Patrol, Cal Transportation, and major power transmission lines
- Mandatory and voluntary evacuations in effect for 5,524 people







FEMA Common Operating Picture






