

- Western Pacific: Invest 90W: High






Tropical Storm Zeta SATELLITE LOOP





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Tropical Storm Zeta WIND WATCHES AND WARNINGS




1 DAY RAINFALL






DAY 1 CONVECTIVE OUTLOOK

Tropical Storm Zeta – Impacts



Lifeline Impacts: (NRCC SLB Oct 28 6:00 p.m. ET and Oct 29 6:00 a.m. ET)

Safety and Security

- LA: voluntary and partial mandatory evacuations for 5 (+1) parishes (approx. 27k)
- MS: mandatory evacuation for City of Gulfport Municipal Marina and low-lying areas of Hancock County; voluntary evacuations for low-lying areas of Jackson and Harrison counties
- AL: voluntary evacuations for low-lying areas of Mobile County

Food, Water, Shelter

- Meals, water and tarps are pre-staged within Regions IV and VI
- LA: 8 water systems serving a population of 2,099 with water outages due to TC Delta; 18 systems remain under boil water advisories affecting 12,566 people
- Shelters: (ARC Midnight Shelter Count as of 7:00 a.m. ET)
 - LA: 5 congregate open with 142 occupants; 3,537 occupants in non-congregate (includes occupants displaced from previous storms)
 - MS: 8 congregate open with 169 occupants
 - AL: 1 congregate open with 10 occupants
 - FL: 2 congregate open with 106 occupants


Energy

- 1.6 million customers without power across the affected area: LA 480k (22%); MS 226k (19%); AL 93k (4.5%); GA 846k (20%) (DOE Eagle-I as of 6:00 a.m. ET)
- 56 generators staged at Craig Field, AL
- LA: 5,500 power restoration crews staged in-state

Transportation

- Ports
 - Closed: LA New Orleans, Baton Rouge, Port of South Louisiana, Plaquemines, New Iberia, St. Bernard, Houma, Port Fouchon, LA Offshore Oil Port, Morgan City; MS – Gulfport and Pascagoula; AL - Mobile
 - Open with restrictions: LA Lake Charles





Tropical Storm Zeta – Response




<u>Current Situation:</u>. Zeta continues to produce damaging winds across portions of the southeastern U.S.

State/Local Preparations and Continuing Response:

- LA EOC at Partial Activation (TC Laura, Delta, Zeta and COVID-19)
 - Governor requested an Emergency Declaration; approved October 27;
 National Guard activated
- AL EOC at Partial Activation (TC Sally, Delta, Zeta and COVID-19);
 Governor declared a state of emergency; National Guard activated
- MS EOC at Partial Activation (TC Delta, Zeta and COVID-19); Governor requested an Emergency Declaration; approved on October 28
- FL EOC at Full Activation (COVID-19)

FEMA/Federal Preparations and Continuing Response:

- NRCC at Level III (day shift only, TC Zeta & COVID-19)
- Region IV RRCC at Level III, day shift
 - IMAT-1 Deployed to MS EOC, LNO supporting virtually; IMAT-2 and LNO deployed to AL EOC
- Region VI RRCC at Level III (COVID-19); RWC is monitoring
 - IMAT-1 and IMAT-2 deployed to Baton Rouge, LA (TC Laura & Zeta)
 - LNO deployed to LA EOC
- SMT deployed in Camp Beauregard, LA (TC Laura/Delta)
- US&R: White IST deployed to Baton Rouge, LA; TX-TF1 deployed to Ponchatoula, LA; TN-TF1 staged in Memphis, TN

COVID-19 Update



<u>Situation:</u> Upward trajectory in COVID-19 case count continues across 42 (+1) states/territories, with 6 (-2) jurisdictions in a plateau status, and 8 (+1) jurisdictions on a downward trajectory; 1,237 (-3) FEMA employees deployed. (COVID-19 SLB, as of Oct 28)

Nationwide Testing: 144,293,207 (+1,483,459) cumulative (COVID-19 SLB, as of Oct 28)





- NWC, all RWCs, and MOCs are monitoring



Flood Hazard Outlook – Tropical Storm Zeta FEMA




Tropical Outlook – Western Pacific




Invest 90W (as of 3:30 a.m. ET)


- 550 miles SSE of Guam
- Moving NW at 5 mph
- Maximum sustained winds 17-23 mph
- May develop into a tropical cyclone within 12 to 24 hours
- Models suggest that it will pass SW of Guam as a small and compact tropical storm on Sunday (ET)
- Isolated thunderstorms expected for Guam and Rota as 90W passes the area
- The heaviest rain and strongest winds remain south of the area over coastal waters
- Formation chance through 24 hours: HIGH






