Background

The House Homeland Security Committee has been tracking terrorist activity linked to the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) since the group's formation. This report was produced by the Committee's Majority Staff and is intended to capture the scope of ISIS external operations against Western countries, including the United States, as well as other terrorist incidents inspired by the group. It provides a high-level examination of ISIS-linked plots and attacks targeting Western countries along with a summary of each incident. At the end of July, ISIS has been tied to at least 243 terrorist plots or attacks against the West since 2014.¹

Note on Methodology

This report is based on open-source data. This includes information from press articles, publicly available government documents, reports from non-governmental organizations, and related materials. For the purposes of this analysis, key terms are used as follows: "ISIS-linked" refers to incidents involving a suspect or suspects who were members of or connected to ISIS through direct communication, pledges of allegiance, or ideological inspiration; "plots" refers to schemes, either executed or disrupted, by an individual or group to commit violent terrorist acts; and the "West" is used at the time of this writing in reference to countries located in Europe and North America, as well as Australia, or targets affiliated with the same outside of the conflict zone in Syria and Iraq.






THE NUMBER OF ISIS-INSPIRED PLOTS IS ON THE RISE

KEY FINDINGS

Islamic State of Iraq and al-Sham (ISIS) leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, after a year of silence and widespread reports regarding his death, reemerged in late August 2018 to exhort his followers to continue attacking Westerners, using whatever means available, in their homelands.

In the nearly hour-long audio recording titled "Give Glad Tidings to the Patient," released to coincide with the Muslim holiday Eid al-Adha, Baghdadi not only offered definitive proof he is still alive—citing recent tensions between the United States and Turkey—he downplayed ISIS' territorial losses and emphasized the importance of homeland attacks in the West to the overall strategy and long-term success of ISIS.

"We bless those who are in the countries of the Crusaders, in Canada, Europe, and elsewhere," Baghdadi said, according to a transcript from the extremist monitoring group SITE. "What they have done to support their brothers, may Allah reward them, the supporters of the Caliphate should follow in their path, and trust in Allah, and carry out an attack that breaks their heart, and rip them apart, either with gunfire, or a stab to their bodies, or a bombing in their countries, for this is equal to a thousand operations here."

Baghdadi would go on to say, "Do not forget about running people over on the roads. Ignite your fight, so that Crusaders will feel its flames."

Perhaps it is just an unsettling coincidence, but the last successful ISIS attack to kill innocent Americans was a vehicle ramming attack in the country of Tajikistan that left four people dead, including two Americans. Two days after the attack, in which the assailants also stabbed the victims, ISIS' official Amaq News Agency released a video showing five Tajikistanis it identified as the perpetrators sitting in front of an Islamic State flag and pledging their allegiance to Baghdadi.

ISIS Able to Project Terror Despite Territorial Losses

Besides being the latest ISIS attack to result in American deaths, the attack in Tajikistan was the first known instance of terrorists targeting Westerners in the country. It is significant because it shows despite ISIS' significant territorial losses, it is still able to find ways to ways to attract new followers and inspire or direct them to attack in new places.

Since the summer of 2014, when the Islamic State declared its self-proclaimed caliphate and Baghdadi appeared at the al-Nuri mosque in Mosul, Iraq to declare himself the "Caliph Ibrahim," ISIS has lost nearly 98 percent of the territory it controlled in Iraq and Syria, according to Brett McGurk, the Special Presidential Envoy for the Global Coalition to Defeat ISIS.¹ Most of these losses have occurred over the last two years, but despite its setbacks, ISIS and its adherents have been linked to 142 incidents—arrests, plots and attacks—targeting Westerners or the West over the last two years.

That compares to 101 ISIS-linked incidents reported in House Homeland's "Terror Gone Viral" report released in 2016. Cumulatively, over the 2014 to 2018 period covered by the Terror Gone Viral reports, ISIS has been linked to 243 incidences, averaging five terrorist incidents per month.²

The Physical Caliphate Becomes Virtual

Much has been made of ISIS' messaging and online propaganda ability. Many observers attribute these two key efforts with ISIS' continued success despite its near military defeat on the battlefield. The Combating Terrorism Center at West Point recently released an analysis that examined the complex structure of ISIS' propaganda operation. The analysis, based on captured ISIS documents, revealed that ISIS runs a "highly choreographed influence campaign in which the group invested significant institutional effort."

ISIS uses this "choreographed campaign" to drive home key themes such as despite the collapse of its proclaimed caliphate, ISIS itself will "endure." In the latest Baghdadi audio recording, he exhorts his followers that "The scale of victory or defeat with the mujahideen, the people of faith and piety, is not tied to a city or a village that was taken," before noting at the end of his statement, "As for you O supporters of the Caliphate everywhere, in the media and the fields, we give you tidings that the State is in the best of shape, because it wishes what is with Allah, and what is with Allah is better and more enduring."

New York Times correspondent Rukimi Callimachi, who has reported extensively from territory once held by ISIS, described finding the word "baqyia," which translates as "remaining or enduring," scrawled across billboards and buildings in cities formerly controlled by the group. Laying out the significance of "endurance" to the ISIS narrative, she noted ISIS has used bagiya as a slogan dating back to its affiliation with al-Qaeda.⁵

The attack by 29-year-old Uzbek national Sayfullo Saipov, who drove a rental truck down a New York City bike path October 31, 2017, takes on all-the-more significance in this context . Papers found in his possession at the scene proclaimed in Arabic that there is, "No God but God and Muhammad is his Prophet," and "Islamic Supplication. It will endure," according to the FBI's criminal complaint. The agent who wrote the complaint noted that based on her training and experience, she knew the expression, "It will endure," referred to ISIS.⁶

A Source of Inspiration

In the complaint, the FBI agent also pointed to a potential source of inspiration for Saipov's attack—the ISIS online propaganda magazine *Rumiyah*. The November 2016 edition of the magazine featured an article on using a vehicle as a primary weapon of attack before using a knife or gun as secondary means. In *Dabiq*, a forerunner to *Rumiyah*, ISIS also praised the July 14, 2016 truck-ramming attack in Nice, France that left 86 dead and 434 wounded, hailing the "brother' who answered 'the Islamic State's calls to target nations participating in the Crusader coalition fighting the Caliphate."

Going back as far as 2014, ISIS' then top spokesman Abu Muhammad al-Adnani implored would-be attackers to use vehicles in attacks. In an audio recording he stated, "If you are not able to find an IED or a bullet, then single out the disbelieving American, Frenchman or any of their allies. Smash his head with a rock or slaughter him with a knife or run him over with your car or throw him down from a high place or choke him or poison him."

Inspiring followers to carry-out attacks in the name of ISIS, and providing them with a "self-help guide" on how to do it, is a major goal of the terror group's media effort. In 2016, the committee's first "Terror Gone Viral" report found 53 percent of ISIS-linked attacks were inspired by the group as opposed to directed. **Over the last two years, the number of ISIS-inspired attacks has gone-up to 63 percent**, which shows that ISIS is making up for its declining ability to direct attacks with an increased ability to inspire others to attack in its name. Only 19 percent of incidents reviewed by the committee over the last two years could be determined to be directed by ISIS, with the remaining 18 percent being unclear on direction or inspiration.

Matin Azizi-Yarand, a 17-year-old from Plano was arrested at his high school May 2, 2018 by Texas law enforcement officials for an ISIS-inspired plot to attack the Stonebriar Centre Mall in Frisco, Texas. He had surveilled the mall and spent at least \$1400 for the purchase of body armor and weapons to execute his attack. He also told an undercover informant of his desire to "make a cop surrender and drop his gun//Then douse him with gasoline and burn him//record it," according to an affidavit for an arrest warrant filed in the case.⁹

The teenager, who decided to target the mall after giving up on plans to travel to Pakistan so he could cross the border to join ISIS in Afghanistan, was inspired to carry out an attack by ISIS propaganda he had read online. He also was using online reference guides produced by ISIS to help plot his attack.¹⁰

Whither the Children

Yarand was one of **22 teenagers or younger who were linked to ISIS incidents** reviewed by the committee over the last two years. Like Yarand, Houston teenager Kaan Sercan Damlarkaya also hoped to travel overseas to join ISIS. Having heard of the announcement of the "khalifa," he made his first attempt to travel and join the group at the age of 15, a few shorts months after Baghdadi's 2014 declaration. Having failed, he tried again at the age of 16, but that attempt was thwarted when a friend he solicited to go with him told his parents who in turn Damlarkaya believed informed the FBI, according to the criminal complaint.¹¹

In December 2017, after an FBI investigation, a Houston grand jury returned a five-count indictment against Damlarkaya for attempting to provide material support to ISIS and for unlawful distribution of explosives information about Triacetone Triperoxide (TATP), often referred to as the "mother of Satan." Damlarkaya was 18.12

ISIS' incitement does not stop with teenagers, it also extends to preteens as well. In 2016, German authorities arrested a 12-year-old boy who attempted a nail bomb attack at a Christmas market in the southern German city of Ludwigshafen that November. The same boy also made an unsuccessful attempt to bomb Ludwigshafen's city hall using a backpack bomb in December 2016. The boy, born in Germany to Iraqi parents, was in contact with an Islamic State supporter and was given instructions using an encrypted messaging app. Because of his age, he could not be held criminally responsible for his attempted bombing under German law.¹³

An Austrian teenager, however, was held responsible for his role in directing the would-be 12-year-old ISIS bomber. Lorenz K, was sentenced to nine years in prison in April 2018 after being found guilty for inciting the German 12-year-old to carry out his attacks. Lorenz, who was only 17 at the time he downloaded bombmaking instructions and forwarded them to the 12-year-old via WhatsApp, filmed himself pledging an oath of allegiance to ISIS in 2016. Lorenz, who was born in Austria to Albanian immigrant parents, also was convicted for plotting to attack U.S. service members at Ramstein Air Base in Germany with a 16-year old girl.¹⁴¹⁵

ISIS Exploitation of Vulnerable Pathways

The committee previously identified refugee flows as a pathway for ISIS to find supporters and infiltrate plotters into the West. That continued to be the case over the last two-years, with 14 ISIS-connected plots and attacks reviewed by the committee involving refugee and asylum seekers.

The most notorious case of ISIS using refugee flows to move fighters involves the November 2015 Paris terrorist attacks. Attackers Ahmad al-Mohammed and M al-Mahod, who were part of the group that attacked the Stade de France, entered Europe via the Greek Island of Leros. From there, it is reported they bought ferry tickets to continue their journey through Europe with Syrian refugees. Though most of the attackers were born in Europe, they fought for ISIS in Syria, and they may have been using the Syrian refugee flows to mask their movements and identities, which were known to European security services.

Further, Hungarian security officials believe the ISIS cell built a "logistics hub" there in the summer of 2015 and began moving Syrian trained fighters into Europe using the "Balkans route" through eastern Europe. Hungary's deputy chief for counterterrorism revealed the mastermind of the Paris attack, Abdelhamid Abaaoud, sent a scout to map-out the route, a discovery they made reviewing the attackers cell phones.¹⁸

Recently, at least one alleged member of ISIS attempted to hide in the United States as a fugitive from justice. Though it came after the time covered by this report, the late August arrest of Omar Ameen, shows the importance of thorough vetting for refugees that come into the United States.

Ameen, a 45-year-old Iraqi refugee and alleged ISIS killer, is charged with the June 2014 murder of a police officer in Iraq, which is seeking his extradition. Ameen allegedly went to the police officer's home as a member of an ISIS convoy and shot the victim as he was on the ground. ISIS later announced the officer's murder on social media. Ameen fled Iraq and eventually settled with family in Sacramento as a refugee. Ameen hid his membership in Al-Qaeda in Iraq and ISIS when he originally applied for refugee status, and later when he applied to become a green card holder, according to the Department of Justice. Ameen remains in custody in California as a flight risk and danger to the community, according to the Sacramento Bee.

Conclusion

House Homeland's Terror Gone Viral Reports have sought to provide a centralized repository to catalogue the ongoing ISIS threat to the West. The findings show that despite ISIS' battlefield losses, the group remains a potent threat in large part due to the viral success of its online propaganda and "how to" efforts. What follows are short summaries of the 243 ISIS-linked incidents reviewed by the committee from 2014 to 2018.

Summary: ISIS-Linked Targeting the West

Tajikistan	Two American cyclists, a Dutch cyclist and a Swiss cyclist were killed by members of the Islamic State.
Germany	A 42-year-old woman was arrested for plotting to carry out an attack with Ricin on behalf of ISIS. Her husband was arrested previously in connection with the planned attack.
Canada	Faisal Hussain killed two people and wounded 13 using a semiautomatic pistol in Toronto's east-end Greektown neighborhood.
Netherlands	Three Dutch men were arrested on suspicion of being members of ISIS. Their DNA was found on guns in Paris linked to ISIS.
France	The French government froze the assets of a Swiss imam, who was previously expelled from France in 2017.
Australia	A 26-year-old man was arrested for planning to travel to a foreign conflict zone to engage in terrorist acts.
England	A 29-year-old West Yorkshire man was arrested for "arranging money to another person knowing it may be used for terrorism."
Germany	A 29-year-old Tunisian man living in Germany was arrested for producing biological weapons.
USA	A 45-year-old woman was arrested in Wisconsin and charged with attempting to provide material support to ISIS – including attack guidance and informational support.
Belgium	A 31-year-old man killed two police officers and a nearby man as well as wounded 4 in an attack claimed by ISIS.
Syria	A senior ISIS commander and French citizen involved in the Paris and Nice attacks was arrested in Syria.
USA	An Indiana man is arrested for attempted material support of ISIS.
France	An Egyptian man suspected of plotting an attack in Paris was arrested by French authorities.
France	A 20-year-old French national born in Chechnya kills one and wounds three in a knife attack. The man pledged allegiance to ISIS in a video he filmed himself.
Germany	A Syrian man is arrested on suspicion of being a member of ISIS.
USA	A 17-year-old boy was arrested in Texas for making terroristic threats and plotting to attack a mall. He was inspired by ISIS propaganda.
Italy	A Gambian asylum-seeker was arrested in Italy for plotting an attack on behalf of ISIS.
Syria (Ger- many)	A Syrian born German national was detained in Syria for assisting ISIS. He was previously identified in the 9/11 Commission Report.
Germany	Three Syrian refugees were detained in Germany on suspicion of ties to ISIS.
Bosnia	Two ISIS members were arrested who appeared to be planning an attack on Sarajevo.
France	Six people were detained for the murder of two police officers by members of ISIS in 2016.

December 11, 2017	USA	Five people were left with minor injuries when 27-year-old Bangladeshi immigrant Akayed Ullah pledged allegiance to ISIS and detonated a foot-long pipe bomb. The bomb did not detonate fully and there was a second device found with the suspect.
December 6, 2017	England	A 31-year-old ISIS supporter was arrested for encouraging terror attacks against Prince George.

December 5, 2017	England	A 20-year-old ISIS supporter appeared in court for a plot to assassinate British Prime Minister Theresa May. He was arrested with a 21-year-old co-defendant who was trying to join ISIS in Libya.
November 10, 2017	Sweden	A Swedish radio station was hijacked to play an ISIS recruitment song for 30 minutes.
November 7, 2017	France, Swit- zerland	Ten people were arrested in a joint counterterrorism operation.
November 3, 2017	Lebanon (Australia)	An Australian teenager was arrested by Lebanese authorities for attempting to travel to Syria to join ISIS.
October 31, 2017	USA	Eight people were killed and almost a dozen injured when 29-year-old Uzbekistan national Sayfullo Habibullaevic Saipov drove down a bicycle path with a rented pickup truck near the World Trade Center in Manhattan.
October 25, 2017	USA	A Michigan man who was arrested by the FBI's counterterrorism team admitted to manufacturing bombs and consuming ISIS propaganda.
October 13, 2017	Austria	A man was arrested for attempting to travel to join ISIS in Syria.
October 1, 2017	France	Two women were stabbed to death in Marseille by an ISIS militant carrying a butcher's knife before the attacker was shot dead by a French soldier.
September 30-October 1, 2017	Canada	A police officer and at least four others were injured during a car and knife lone-wolf attack outside a football game in Edmonton. The assailant was a Somali refugee.
September 19, 2017	Germany	Two men were arrested in Berlin for participating in terrorist activities in Iraq.
September 15, 2017	England	An 18-year-old man was arrested for attempting to blow up a train car on the London underground. He wounded 29.
September 13, 2017	Germany	A 24-year-old Syrian national was arrested under allegations of being a member of several terrorist organizations, including ISIS.
September 12, 2017	Syria (USA)	An American fighting for ISIS turned himself over to US backed forces in Syria.

July 18, 2017	Ireland	A Waterford man was arrested for providing and attempting to provide funds to international terrorist groups.
July 17, 2017	Iraq (Germa- ny)	A 16-year-old German girl was arrested in Iraq after the city of Mosul was secured by Iraqi forces.

October 2014	Canada	Canadian police killed a terrorist who shot a soldier at Canada's National War Memorial and then proceeded to attack the Canadian Parliament. The suspect was suspected to have been influenced by ISIS and other jihadist propaganda and reportedly sought to travel to Libya and Syria.
October 2014	USA	A hatchet-wielding man attacked four police officers in New York City, wounding two. Police killed the attacker, who was believed to have been inspired by ISIS and other jihadist groups.

October 2014	Canada	An ISIS-inspired extremist struck two Canadian soldiers with his car in Quebec, killing one and wounding the other. The suspect was killed by police in pursuit.
October 2014	Denmark	A Danish teenager radicalized by online ISIS propaganda was arrested after stabbing her mother to death, along with a 29-year-old Iraqi accomplice.
October 2014	UK	Several ISIS inspired British residents were arrested plotting a potentially "significant" terrorist attack in London, reportedly public beheadings of civilians. One of the suspects had allegedly returned from Syria where he had been connected with ISIS.
September 2014	Australia	An ISIS-inspired teen stabbed two police officers in Australia after reportedly having his passport revoked over concerns he would try to join the group.
September 2014	Australia	Australian police arrested more than a dozen individuals in counterter- rorism raids, including one who was reportedly in touch with an opera- tive in Syria about planning a public beheading in Sydney.
September 2014	Algeria	A French citizen hiking in Algeria was kidnapped and beheaded by an ISIS affiliate, which later released a video claiming credit.
May 2014	Belgium	Four civilians were killed in a terrorist attack at a Jewish museum in Brussels. The shooting was perpetrated by an ISIS supported who had returned from Syria in 2013.
May 2014	USA	The FBI arrested an upstate New York man who sought to support ISIS and plotted to shoot and kill members of the U.S. military who returned from Iraq.
March 2014	Switzerland	Swiss authorities arrested four Iraqis suspected of planning a terrorist attack in Europe in the name of ISIS. The suspects had sought to purchase toxic gas and explosives for their attack.
February 2014	France	Police in the French Riviera arrested a French-Algerian extremist who fought with ISIS in Syria and was believed to be planning a terrorist attack in the country using explosives.
