HITRAC Infrastructure Intelligence Note

22 February 2007

(U) This Infrastructure Intelligence Note provides the Department of Homeland Security's perspective on the 13 February 2007 statement from al-Qa'ida senior leader Ayman al-Zawahiri. (The Infrastructure Intelligence Note replaces the Private Sector Note as HITRAC's method of sharing time sensitive information with State, local, and tribal governments and the private sector.)

(U) Ayman Al-Zawahiri Statement Reviews Events of the Past Year

(U//FOUO) Al-Qa'ida second-in-command Ayman al-Zawahiri's 13 February 2007 video statement, "Tremendous Lessons and Events in the Year 1427 AH" (the Islamic year ending in January 2007), calls for Muslim unity and gives his views on issues such as U.S. foreign policy and domestic politics, the Middle East, and Islamic jihad. The statement—his third this year—makes no specific threats against the Homeland, but advocates continuing jihad against the United States and its allies—particularly in Afghanistan and Iraq.

(U//FOUO) DHS has no credible, specific intelligence that al-Qa'ida or its affiliates are planning imminent attacks against the Homeland.
